1978. Prednisone

RCT/Prednisone/UC/Induction

Randomized single-blind controlled trial. Patients with active ulcerative colitis (proctocolitis) were randomized to prednisone 40 mg /day one dose in the morning or 10mg 4 times per day.

Patients already taking salazopyrin continued it in unaltered dose.

Primary endpoints: Response at day 7 and 14

Results: N=45

- Response at day 14 was: 53.1% for both arms.
- Side effects were comparable between groups.

Conclusion:

There were no differences in efficacy and safety between single or multiple doses of prednisone. As single dose is more convenient for patients and adrenal suppression is less than with a multiple small dose regimen this should be recommended in UC patients needing steroids.

A Comparison of Oral Prednisolone Given as Single or Multiple Daily Doses for Active Proctocolitis




Fig. 1. The activity score at the beginning and end of the study.
